

## Chateau® Herbicide SW—A Proven Preemergence Residual Herbicide

- ▶ **Broad Spectrum:** controls more than 60 tough weeds, including lambsquarters, prickly lettuce (China lettuce), shepherd's-purse, pigweeds, kochia, mustards, common groundsel, Russian thistle, purslane, annual nightshades, puncturevine, watergrass, marehail and many other annual broadleaf weeds and grasses
- ▶ **Long-Lasting:** stays where you put it; won't leach or co-distillate; no photodegradation
- ▶ **Weather-Ready:** remains active until ¼-inch rainfall or irrigation releases its activity

### How To Use\*

<b>Rate</b>	4 oz/A per application. Do not apply more than 8 oz/A per season. Wait at least 60 days between applications. Tank mix with labeled rates of paraquat to control emerged weeds.
<b>Timing</b>	Apply in late fall to control winter annuals, followed by another application in spring to control summer annuals. Do not apply before Nov. 25 or after Mar. 1.
<b>Method</b>	Broadcast
<b>Spray Volume</b>	15–30 gal/A
<b>Adjuvant</b>	Non-ionic surfactant at 0.25% v/v as recommended on the paraquat label
<b>PHI</b>	80 days

\*Apply only to dormant, healthy mint stands



## Other Important Information

- ▶ *Chateau* requires at least ¼ inch of irrigation or rainfall for activation
- ▶ Fields plowed or harrowed after a *Chateau* application will result in less effective preemergence activity
- ▶ Follow instructions for spray tank clean out immediately after application. See label for details.

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## Crop Age and Condition

Apply only to established, healthy, dormant one- to three-year-old mint stands in good condition. Be sure roots and rhizomes are undamaged.

- ▶ Do not apply to mint stands established more than three years
- ▶ Do not apply to row or baby mint, use only on established meadow mint
- ▶ Do not apply to mint weakened by diseases, insects (such as mint root borer and nematodes), drought, soil salts, high soil pH, previous pesticides, winter injury or double-cutting as severe injury might occur

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## Weather-Related Risks

- ▶ Many weather-related factors, including high wind, splashing or heavy rains or cool conditions at or near mint emergence may result in mint injury in fields treated with *Chateau*. User should assume these risks before using *Chateau*.

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## Geographic Restrictions—Oregon

- ▶ Do not apply *Chateau* on mint in Southern Union County (south of Ladd Canyon) or Baker County in Oregon
